

Taken Over, A Poem

A young person in the GLBT Host Home Program wrote the poem below and asked staff to share it. Often in the nonprofit world, and at Avenues, we get stuck on sharing stories that are positive and leave us feeling good. The stories that challenge us the most and call out systems that continue to perpetuate prejudice and discrimination, are the stories we tend to overlook or avoid.

The poem below highlights the very real barriers and systems working against the young people in our community who are experiencing homelessness. Along with stories that focus on youth resilience we must also create space for stories that are raw and honest, and speak to the oppressive ways systems have impacted youth. For that reason we chose not to edit out strong language.

Taken Over

Can't think straight. Can't do anything right. What do I do now? I'm stuck my life is fucked. Can't help me cause I'm dust. Floating in mid air. This is not fair. Where do I belong. Dope killed hope. Stopped the flow. Where will I go. I have no home. I feel so alone. I crumble as I tremble with fear. I need to get out of here. Listen to me. I want to flee. Will I ever be free again? The system is twisted. As they got me hanging. Slowly I'm fading as days pass my rights flash, turns to trash. There's no use they just get refused as I speak they want to flee from the truth. When they see me fight for my right till there's nothing left as they think they know what's best. Feeling trapped that a fact. Being tracked as they're waiting in silence till i collapse. Being a product as they make profit off me. Not a human till you prove them. Moving like a pawn not knowing what I've done. Feeling like a dumby as they make the money. I'm not backing down I'm standing my

ground because I'm done being their clown.

The Red Affair: Over 15 Years Of Partnership

"In 2002 she (Suzanne Erickson) toured Avenues. She could see what a need there was for Avenues," Kari Melchert, Salon Director of Jungle Red Salon Spa Gallery, said.

Suzanne, owner and CEO of Jungle Red, has been supporting Avenues ever since that fateful tour. Jungle Red has donated thousands of dollars worth of in-kind support, and has raised even more funds through their special events. What started as fundraiser hosted at the salon has grown into The Red Affair, a soirée with hundreds of guests raising over \$20,000 for youth experiencing homelessness.

"One of our core values as a company is to support our local community. This is our way of contributing to that," Kari said. "We really appreciate how Avenues has lots of different programs to assist youth in achieving their dreams."

This year's Red Affair, on April 27, is supporting Avenues' integrative health and wellness team. Their goal is to raise \$30,000, providing critical access to mental health therapy and nursing support.

Kari said guests can look forward to a new event space, St. Mary's University Center, music from members of The Sounds of Blackness, closing party with DJ Jake Rudh, and awesome auction items including a one week trip to Aikens Lake Wilderness Resort. All proceeds from the event benefit Avenues.

"We feel like it's a great cause to celebrate a night out," Kari said. "It's black tie formal attire so get dressed up and celebrate all we can do as a community!"
