

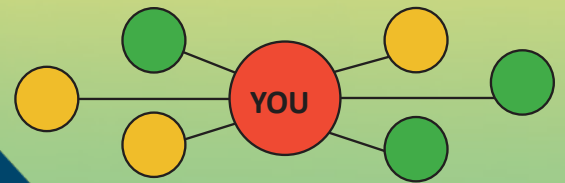
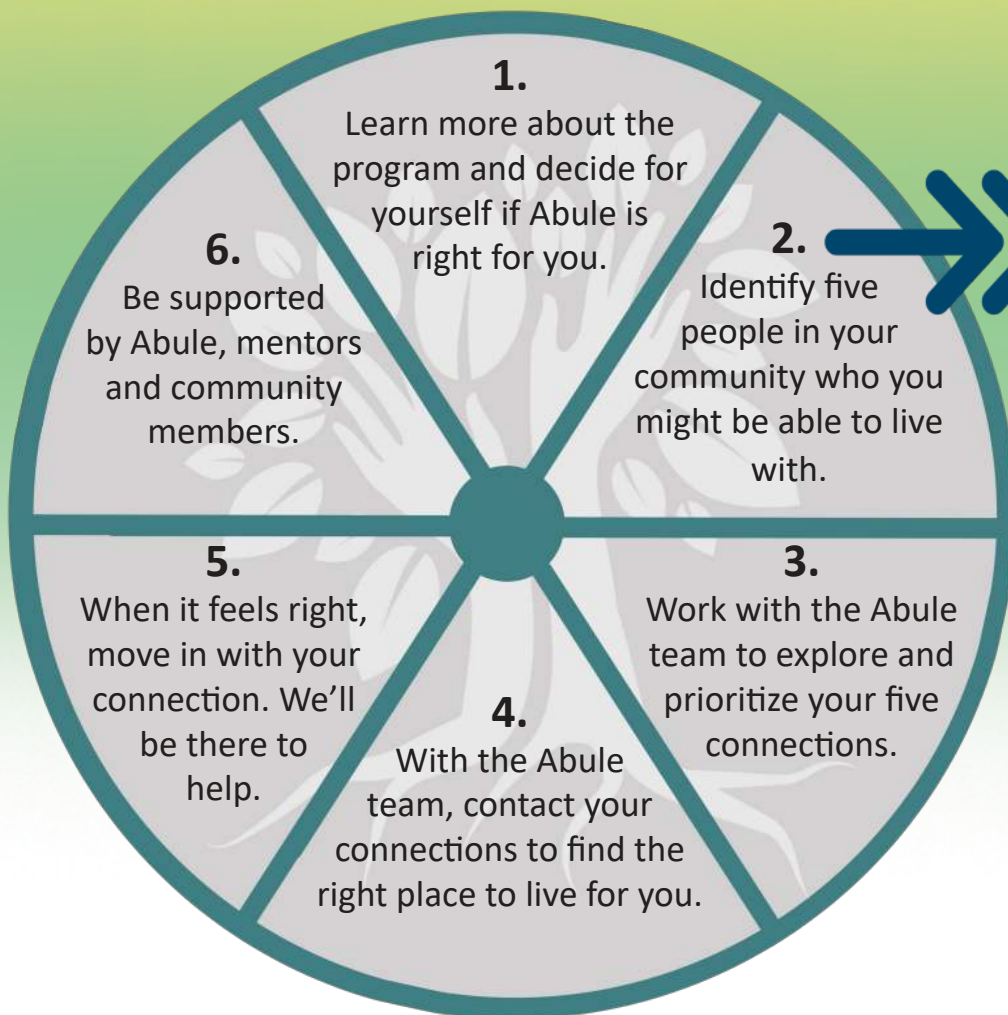


# Abule

Abule (A-boo-lay), a program of Avenues for Youth, translates to “The Village” in the Yoruba language. Abule is a collective housing program for youth who identify as Black, Indigenous and people of color (BIPOC) where community members share their home and resources with youth experiencing homelessness.
